MTSD Board to Vote on Appointment of New Homestead Assistant Principal

MEQUON, Wis. — The Mequon-Thiensville School District will recommend to its board of education that Eric Ebert be named assistant principal at Homestead High School.

Ebert, who previously taught at Hamilton High School in Sussex, would serve alongside fellow Assistant Principal Kari Lutter. Brett Bowers is principal at Homestead.

“We are thrilled to have the opportunity to welcome Eric to the Homestead High School community and look forward to the exceptional experience he would bring to our school,” Bowers said. “Over the course of his career, Eric has demonstrated his commitment to education and passion for igniting each student’s potential.”

In addition to teaching a range of courses at Hamilton, Ebert has assisted students as an academic and career planning coordinator, high school technology coach, Model UN club advisor and personalized learning committee representative. He has also served as an AP Consultant and served on the AP Comparative Development Committee for the College Board. Ebert has further served as a high school football and strength, agility and speed coach.

“Eric has a truly broad perspective in the world of education,” Bowers said. “There’s little doubt that he will be an asset to our school community from day one.”

Ebert holds a master’s degree in Education Leadership from the Milwaukee School of Engineering and master’s degree in Educational Psychology from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He received a bachelor’s degree in Political Science from UW-Madison.
