Please find below a summary of the Wilson School Growth Plan (SGP). The accompanying documents provide greater detail in regards to the goals, actions, and time line for accomplishing these important steps in increasing student achievement for all students.

1	By the end of 2012, a minimum of 98% of all Wilson Kindergarten, 1 st and 2 nd grade students will score proficient or advanced on the Spring MTSD ELA Assessment.	Spring 2012
2	By the end of 2012 there will be no achievement gap between special education and regular education students, as measured by the (Spring) District ELA Assessment (grades K-2) or WKCE Reading Assessment (grades 3-5).	Spring 2012
3	By the end of 2012, a minimum of 98% of all Wilson students will score proficient or advanced on the May MTSD Math Assessment.	Spring 2012

The School Growth Plan goals above were the result of analysis of student data and consideration of District goals. Baseline data from the 2009-2010 school year and current data from the 2010-2011 school year are the rationale for these goals and include the following:

Baseline and Current Data

Results of the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 District Spring ELA Assessment scores of kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade students show the following percentages that are proficient or advanced:

Grade	Baseline: 2009-2010	Current: 2010-2011
Kindergarten	76.9%	81.8%
1 st	89.2%	74.2%
2 nd	62.1%	75.6%

Results of the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 District Spring ELA scores of the kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade students and WKCE reading scores for 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students show the following percentages that are proficient or advanced:

While the special education population is too small to report publically, the data indicates a statistical difference between regular and special education students in kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade District ELA scores and 3rd, 4th and 5th grade WKCE scores in reading.

Results of the May MTSD Math Assessment for kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th grade show the following percentages that are proficient or advanced:

Grade	Baseline: 2009-2010	Current: 2010-2011
Kindergarten	83.8%	86.5%
1 st	86.3%	83.5%
2 nd	86.8%	91.0%
3 rd	76.1%	88.6%
4 th	90.3%	87.6%
