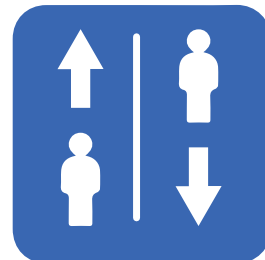
The Mequon-Thiensville School District is committed to the health and safety of our students and staff.



HEALTH CONSIDERATIONS INCLUDE:



- Minimize high touch surfaces with:
 - *Touchless toilet flush valves*
 - *Touchless faucets*
 - *Touchless bottle filler stations*
 - *Touchless separate entrance and exit from restrooms, where possible*



- Enlarge common spaces to alleviate student congestion where possible
- Create separate entrance and exit paths where feasible
- Improve traffic flow in parking lots to maximize safety and increase social distance during student pick-up and drop-off



- Increase the number of sinks in hallways to make handwashing easy
- Include antimicrobial furniture and surfaces when possible
- Strategic placement of hand sanitizer and mask dispensers to encourage use
- Operable windows in classrooms, where possible, to increase airflow
- Install ultraviolet (UV) filters in HVAC systems
