Dear Mequon-Thiensville School District Families:

On March 13, we announced that the Mequon-Thiensville School District would close for several weeks to help prevent the further spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) in our community. On March 25, Governor Tony Evers ordered an extension to the school closures in our state. In keeping with this mandate, the current plan is to keep schools closed until at least Thursday, April 23. We will continue to keep you updated.

The closures will continue to affect all MTSD programming, including before- and after-school activities, all athletic, co-curricular, and recreation department programs. Student meals will remain available, and you can find more information online.

Distance learning officially begins on Monday, March 30. We will continue to provide distance learning through the end of the school year as long as our school doors are closed. You can expect to receive more information from your child's teacher or teachers by 10 a.m. on Monday. Though our doors are closed, we are actively working to maintain connections and support for all students in our school community. Please note that Friday, April 10 and Monday, April 13 were originally scheduled as non-school days in observance of Good Friday and the Easter holiday. On Monday, April 13, educators will make enrichment options available for students, but regular lessons and teacher interaction are not expected.

This has been a challenging time for our entire school community. I thank you for your patience, understanding, and words of support as we have dealt with this unprecedented situation.
